Lifetime Achievement Award Mr. Bing Thom, Bing Thom Architects Inc.

During a sparkling 40-year career, Vancouver-based architect Bing Thom has spread his innovative design and urban planning concepts across Canada and the world.

His most notable creations include the Hong Kong Pavilion at Expo '86, Canada Pavilion for Expo '92 in Seville, Spain, master urban plans for the City of Dalian and the City of Yuxi in China. Other signature projects include UBC's Chan Centre for the Performing Arts, Richmond's Aberdeen Centre and Washington, D.C.'s Arena Stage theatre complex.

Bing Thom was born in Hong Kong in 1940 and moved to Vancouver in 1950 with his two older brothers. At that time, none of them could speak a word of English.

The 1958 Brussels World's Fair showcasing the world's best architecture and design made a huge impression on him. He began studying architecture at UBC and graduated in



1966. After earning a master's degree in architecture at UC Berkeley and working in Singapore and Tokyo, Thom joined the renowned architect, Arthur Erickson's firm.

In 1980, he founded his own firm, Bing Thom Architects, seeing himself in the tradition of the "master builder". With his strong trans-Pacific roots, his thinking is a fusion of Asian and Western cultural influences.

The Bing Thom Architects Foundation has supported numerous cultural and social activities. He is also serving on the Boards of the University of British Columbia and the Vancouver Public Library.

He received various awards, not limited to the Order of Canada, the Queen Elizabeth II Golden Jubilee Medal, and the 2010 Royal Architectural Institute of Canada Architectural Firm of the Year Award.

After many years of success with Pharmacia, she decided it was time to step out on her own.

Irene realized that there was a niche in the pharmaceutical marketplace and she wanted to fill it. She formed EVEREST Clinical Research Services Inc. in 2004.

Everest Clinical Research manages medical statistics and programming for pharmaceutical and biotech companies. Irene knew that many Pharmaceutical companies outsource these services, and she forged ahead to make Everest the firm these companies would turn to. Large retailers like Walmart were one of the first to sign up to sell their figurines. Soon after, Round 5 acquired a licensing agreement with the Ultimate Fighting Championship (UFC) which now gives them access to literally hundreds of Martial Arts celebrities.

After their success with Walmart and signing with the UFC, Jakks Pacific, one of the biggest toy manufacturers in the world, wanted in on the action and formed a strategic alliance with the Lau's and now, Round 5 has access to many untapped international markets!

Today, over 6,000 retail outlets in North America including Toys R Us, Target, K Mart, Zellers, Best Buy and of course, Walmart, carry their products. And, the popularity of their figurines doesn't seem to be letting up. Sales continue to increase worldwide.

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
